development of four traditional croft-style houses at Sand, near Achnasheen in Rossshire, has been commended by Scottish Natural Heritage.

The Meriel, Tieve and Kelby sit in grounds of more than an acre each and have a kitchen/dining room, master bedroom with en suite and a further bedroom with a Jack and Jill bathroom. The Torrin has the same, but with a family bathroom.

The Celtic house names reflect their positions in the development: the Meriel (shining sea) has an unobstructed sea view, the Tieve (hillside) is next to the hillside overlooking the sea, the Kelby (place by flowing water) enjoys the backdrop of a water-fall and the Torrin (from the hills) sits in a peaceful corner.

The finishes include drystone walls, double chimneys, hand-crafted Caithness slab window sills, pitched slate roofs, vaulted timber ceilings, solid oak floorboards. hand-made double-

glazed windows and a traditional wood-burning stove.

Gairloch is 16 miles away, Ullapool 40 and Inverness is 73.

The kitchen/dining rooms are double aspect with Italian slate tiled floors and recessed lighting. Integrated appliances include fridge, freezer, washing machine, double oven and a touch control hob. The living room has a gable end fireplace handcrafted from Scottish stone, solid oak floor, vaulted timber ceiling, and a feature door to the loft.

These properties present an opportunity to acquire a house in a spectacular location. The nearby village of Laide has a shop and post office, while Aultbea is five minutes drive and has a general store, butcher, post office, two churches, garage, primary school, and a small harbour. Many pursuits are available locally including sea angling, golf, sailing, wind surfing, hill walking, bird watching and mountaineering.
